#### Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended December 31, 2017

Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Principles

Nature of Activities: Little Children of the World, Inc. (LCW) is a not-for-profit, international Christian service agency dedicated to helping develop caring communities for the world's children at risk. LCW has two projects in the Philippines (Dumaguete, Leyte), and one in Haiti – Christian School of New Vision (CSNV).

The Dumaguete project was established in 1989 and incorporated as the Little Children of the Philippines and serves as a prototype for the development of additional projects. A Memorandum of Agreement was signed for the Leyte project in 2002 wherein the "Leyte project director shall seek financial support and manage the program in a way consistent with LCP/LCW's By-Laws, Articles of Incorporation and Manual of Operation." (Memorandum of Agreement, Article II:I, page 2).

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Organization have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and, accordingly, reflect all significant receivables, payables and other liabilities.

Basis of Presentation: Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the *Financial Accounting Standards Board* in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, "Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations". Under SFAS No. 117, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of the net positions: unrestricted net positions, temporarily restricted net positions and permanently restricted net positions. The financial statements report amounts separately for the classes of net positions as follows:

- A. Unrestricted net positions are those currently available for use by LCW's Board of Directors at their discretion, and those resources invested in buildings and equipment within the context of the ministry.
- B. Temporarily restricted net positions are those stipulated by donors for specific operating purpose or those not currently available for use until commitments regarding their use has been fulfilled.
- C. Permanently restricted net positions are those stipulated by donors for the endowment fund.

Fund Accounting: Separate Fund Accounting is used for Leyte Project with an account in Spokane, Washington. These funds are restricted by donors for this specific LCW projects (SFAS117).

**Donated Goods and Services**: A large number of volunteers have contributed significant amounts of time to the Organization without compensation. The financial statements do not reflect the value of this contributed time since the services do not require specialized skills. Materials and other assets received as donations are recorded in the accompanying financial statements at their fair values at the date of receipt.

Cash and Cash Equivalents: For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Organization considers highly liquid financial instruments purchased with a maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

**Property and Equipment:** Fixed assets greater than \$600 have been recorded at cost or, if donated, fair value at date of receipt. Depreciation is provided on a declining balance basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the basis of accounting disclosed above requires management to make estimates and assumptions that effect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Income Tax Status: LCW qualifies as a tax-exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, has no provision for federal income taxes. However, income from certain activities not directly related to the Organization' tax-exempt purpose could be subject to taxation as unrelated business income. In addition, the Organization qualifies for the charitable contribution deduction under Section 170(b)(1)(A) and has been classified as an organization that is not a private foundation under Section 509(a)(2).

#### Note 2 - Concentrations of Credit Risk

Financial instruments which potentially subject the Organization to concentrations of credit risk consist primarily of cash and cash equivalents. At December 31, 2017, the cash and cash equivalents did not exceed FDIC insured levels. The Organization has not experienced any losses in such accounts and believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk on such balances.

#### Note 3 - Operating Leases

The Organization currently leases its office and housing facilities on a year to year basis. Rent paid for such facilities was \$5,580 for the year ended December 31, 2017. Contributions designated to cover the rental cost of these facilities have been recorded as support in the accompanying financial statements.

#### Note 4 - Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing the various programs, fund raising and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of functional expenses. Certain costs have been allocated among the programs and fund raising activities benefited.

#### Note 5 - Investments

The Organization reports investments in accordance with Statement of Financial Accounting Standards No. 115, Accounting for Certain Investments in Debt and Equity Securities. This statement addresses the accounting and reporting for investments in equity securities that have readily determined fair values and for all investments in debt securities. Those investments are to be classified in three categories and accounted for as follows:

- Debt securities that the Organization has the positive intent and ability to hold to maturity are classified as investment securities and reported at amortized cost.
- Debt and equity securities that are bought and held principally for the purpose of selling them in the near term are classified as trading securities and reported at fair value, with unrealized gains and losses included in earnings.
- Debt and equity securities not classified as either investment securities or trading securities are classified as available-for-sale securities and reported at fair value, with unrealized gains and losses excluded from earnings and reported in a separate component of stockholders' equity.

As of December 31, 2017, all of the investments of the Organization are classified as trading securities.




